

Proof of French Language Ability

What proofs of French language ability are accepted by the Quebec French Language Board (Office québécois de la langue française)?

According to Art. 35 of the Charter of the French Language, professional order candidates are deemed as having appropriate knowledge of the official language if they:

- Have received no less than three years of secondary or post-secondary instruction, full time and in French;
- Have passed the fourth- or fifth-grade secondary level examinations in French as first language;
- Have obtained a secondary school certificate in Quebec during or after the 1985-86 school year.

Candidates must provide official documents, such as diplomas or official grade transcripts, to prove they meet these requirements.

What can I do if I don't have the required proof?

Candidates to the CRHA or CRIA profession who don't have the required proofs must pass the OQLF's French exam, a prerequisite for obtaining the title. The OQLF exam is free, and it can be done at the same time as or after the Order's equivalency exam.

I took francization classes when I arrived in Quebec. Does the OQLF consider these classes as proof of my French language abilities?

These classes are interesting, even necessary in some cases, but unfortunately they don't constitute sufficient proof of one's French language abilities.

How to obtain the CRHA/CRIA title through equivalency

Submit a membership request **3 years or less** after obtaining one of the following diplomas as per special agreement, and after completing 14 courses (42 credits) in a human resources specialization from the following list, as defined by the Order and participating universities:

- Baccalauréat en administration des affaires avec spécialisation en gestion des ressources humaines, HEC Montréal;
- Baccalauréat en administration des affaires avec concentration en gestion des ressources humaines, TÉLUQ;
- Bachelor of Commerce in Human Resource Management, Concordia University;
- Baccalauréat en administration des affaires avec cheminement spécialisé en gestion des ressources humaines, Université Laval;
- Baccalauréat en administration avec concentration en gestion des ressources humaines, Université du Québec à Rimouski;
- Baccalauréat en administration des affaires avec cheminement spécialisé en gestion des ressources humaines, Université de Sherbrooke.



Required documents

- Bachelor's degree diploma (original document), or certificate of completion of studies.
- Official grade transcript.
- For Concordia University graduates: Proof of French language ability (Art. 35 of the French Language Charter).
- Photo ID.

If you can't provide the required proof of French language ability, you will have to take the OQLF's French exam for professional order candidates. This is a free exam.

The Equivalence Committee may ask graduates of these programs who don't have the required number of credits to take the Order's equivalency exam.
